




Positive Recognition for expected behaviour

- Specific and descriptive praise verbal, smile, thumbs-up gesture
- Dojo's (EYFS & KS1)
- Team Points (KS2) max 3 at once
- Phone call home
- Postcard home
- HOS tea party (1/2 termly)
- Celebration assemblies linked to rules, given specific certificates
- Newsletter mention
- HT awards





Consequences for Unexpected behaviour

- Warning
- Move to another class to complete work for 5 minutes
- 5 minutes off play (including a restorative conversation) consequence room in YG's. Inform parents (CPOMs/pre-written generic email)
- 2 or 5 minutes off 'Friday free time'
- Inform a senior leader
- Inform HOS
- On-report record/check in
- In-school exclusion
- Suspension
- Exclusion

FRIDAY FREE TIME

- Whole school initiative- consistency is vital
- Friday afternoon
- KS1 from 2.30pm
- Years 3/4 2.25-2.50pm
- Years 5/6 2.50-3.15pm
- KSI can lose a maximum of two minutes a day
- KS2 can lose a maximum of 5 minutes a day
- One teacher will facilitate children who are missing free time across each year group on a rota. Consistent restorative activity across year group.
- Sports activities/ use of quad/use of quiet area/use of library/ leisure area/ apple mac/ colouring/Lego etc supervised by other 3 teachers in the year group.



PHONICS AND SPELLING

- We are continuing with the phonics programme Little Wandle Letters and Sounds.
- Children will take part in daily phonics lessons. These will be reviewed at Christmas.
- Interventions will be put in place if needed.

READING

- Your child will be bringing home a phonics based book every Friday. This will be changed on a weekly basis. This will be the book they read in school during the previous week. These books should be returned on the Friday.

 Your child can change this book whenever they wish.

Help your child with reading

I Spy

Play 'I Spy' games. Can you find words beginning with...? Can you find a picture of a ...? How many ... can you see?

Ask Questions

Ask questions about the story as you read it e.g. What is the story about? Why do you think they made that choice? Was it a good choice? Why did that happen? What do you think will happen next? What was your favourite part of the story? Why?

Make it Fun

Enjoy reading together. Give characters funny voices and engage with the pictures. Make a game out of finding words that rhyme or start with the same sound.

Create

Use reading to inspire drawings or new stories.

Be Seen

Make sure you are seen reading. Keep books magazines at easy reach.

Get Out

Go to your public library regularly. Find the books you loved as a kid to read together.

Go Online

Look online & in app stores for appropriate word&spellinggames.

Make Space

Have a special place or a certain time when you read together.

Read everything out loud.

Books, poems, nursery rhymes, newspaper & magazine articles, food labels...

anything that is close to hand!

MASTERY MATHS

- This year we will be using a Maths Mastery approach. A Maths Mastery approach follows a CPA approach. This approach means that children will experience their learning with Concrete resources first, then Pictorially before moving to Abstract (number) based learning.

END OF KEY STAGE 1 ASSESSMENTS

- Statutory End of KS1 assessments (SATs) are no longer compulsory, however we will still be asking the children to sit these to inform our teacher judgements.
- Children will complete the following papers:
 - Maths Arithmetic
 - Maths Reasoning
 - Reading Paper 1
 - Reading Paper 2
 - SPAG
- Past papers can be found by googling 'Key Stage 1 Assessment papers.'

RSE

• In the second half of the summer term the children will have three RSE lessons learning about differences.

• They will be learning about the concept of gender stereotypes, the differences between male and female babies (linking this to their knowledge of male and female animals), and naming body parts.
