<p><u>Draw and Make</u> Draw and paint your own cave painting. Can you use charcoal and berries to add colour to your painting? Research the Cave the Altamira for inspiration!</p>	<p><u>Draw and Make</u> Make a 3D model of a mountain.</p>	<p><u>Draw and Make</u> Make a rock garden at home. Take photos of what you have created and bring it in. Can you label the different types of rocks that you have found? Can you make any patterns using the rocks? Look at the artist Andy Goldsworthy for inspiration.</p>
<p><u>Research</u> Research what tools were used in the stone age and create a fact file about them.</p>	<p><u>Research</u> Research ways to be safer on the internet. Can you create a poster with dos and don'ts about staying safe?</p>	<p><u>Research</u> Can you research what people in the Stone Age used to eat? Can you make a menu for what a meal would look like?</p>
<p><u>Write</u> Write a diary entry of a geologist or archaeologist. What are you going to look for? What might you discover? What exciting adverbs or adjectives could you use to make it exciting for the reader?</p>	<p><u>Write</u> Choose a book set either in the future or the past and write a review about it. Things to include: What you liked/didn't like about it. Your favourite character. Would you recommend it to a friend?</p>	<p><u>Write</u> Write a poem (can be any type: haiku, acrostic, or a tongue twister) about a topic of your choice. Use lots of amazing adjectives or verbs to entertain your audience.</p>
<p><u>Maths</u> Create your own place value board game. Can the players partition numbers into hundreds, tens and ones? Can the player compare numbers using < and >? Could you challenge the players by using numbers to add and subtract?</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> My answer is 45. What was my question? Can you think of 5-word problems that would match this answer?</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Collect all the ages in your family. Can you add all these numbers together? Can you order them from biggest to smallest? Can you compare them using < and >?</p>
